- 2. Hanoi. Theory of recursion.
- 3. Madurai, India (in 1806). Famous mathematician and logician.
- 4. Saint-Petersburg, Russia. Founder of graph theory.
- 5. Zurich (August 1897). major awards, medals, and prizes in mathematics are presented at ICM, e.g. The Fields Medal, the Nevanlinna Prize, the Gauss Prize, and the Chern Medal.
- 6. Stanford University. In 2014, Maryam Mirzakhani became both the first woman and the first Iranian honored with the Fields Medal, the most prestigious award in mathematics.
